Current Reciprocal Permit Countries As of January 2016

Some nations have what is known as a "bilateral" operating agreement with the US. What this means is that Amateurs from each country have a means of operating from the other country. But note: Just because there is a bilateral agreement does not necessarily mean you may simply go to the other country and operate. Some countries require you to apply for a formal permit. You should check the list of specific country requirements for the proper procedures.

*** Including Bermuda, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands, Channel Islands (including Guernsey and Jersey) Falkland Islands (including South Georgia Islands and South Sandwich Islands), Gibraltar, Isle of Man, Montserrat, St. Helena,(including Ascension Island, Gough Island, Tristan Da Cunha Island), Northern Ireland, and the Turks and Caicos Islands
